## Community Partners Newark Public Library and La Casa de Don Pedro Offer Free English as a Second Language Classes at Three Locations This Fall



The Newark Public Library, in partnership with La Casa de Don Pedro, will offer English as a Second Language (ESL) classes at three locations, free of charge. The ESL classes are made possible by funding from a grant from the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Readiness to support adult literacy and community-library collaborations.

Space is limited. Anyone interested in attending fall classes must preregister at La Casa de Don Pedro, 39 Broadway. Students will be placed in a class that will teach to their level of English fluency. Part of the pre-registration process is an interview to determine the best level for each ESL participant. Classes will be offered at three Library locations, at Main Library, located at 5 Washington Street, at Branch Brook Branch Library, located at 235 Clifton Avenue, and at Van Buren Branch Library, located at 140 Van Buren Street. Classes will begin in September and continue through November or December, depending on location.
