Pulitzer prize-winning journalist Jonathan Capehart was born and raised in Newark and is a graduate of Saint Benedict's Preparatory School. Capehart is a *Washington Post* editorial board member, hosts the *Cape Up* podcast, serves as anchor of *The Sunday Show with Jonathan Capehart* on MSNBC, and is a regular contributor on *PBS NewsHour*.



**LAURA MARSH**

Laura Marsh is the literary editor of the *New Republic*, and co-host of *The Politics of Everything* podcast. She has written for the *New York Review of Books*, *Bookforum*, and *Dissent*.



**LORETTA ROSS**

Loretta Ross is an award-winning, nationally-recognized expert on racism and racial justice, women's rights and human rights. Her work emphasizes the intersectionality of social justice issues and how it can fuel transformation. Ross is a visiting associate professor at Smith College and has co-written three books on reproductive justice.



**NADINE STROSSEN**

New York Law School Professor Emerita Nadine Strossen, past national President of the American Civil Liberties Union (1991-2008), is a frequent speaker/media commentator on constitutional law and civil liberties who has testified before Congress on multiple occasions. Her most recent book is *HATE: Why We Should Resist It with Free Speech, Not Censorship* (2018)
