The Newark Public Library Offers Free Computer Classes

The Newark Public Library is pleased to offer a variety of free computer classes for the public. Classes taught in English for this August will be: Mouse on Thursday, August 1 from 6-7 pm; Email 1 on Thursday, August 22 from 6-8 pm; Email 2 on Wednesday, August 28 from 6-8 pm; Word 1 on Wednesday, August 7 from 6-8 pm; Word 2 on Wednesday, August 21 from 6-8 pm; Excel 1 on Tuesday, August 13 from 6-8 pm and on Saturday, August 17 from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm. The introductory Resume Preparation class will be held on Saturday, August 3 from 11:30 am-1:30 pm and on Tuesday, August 27, from 6-8 pm. The more advanced Resume Clinic will be offered on Monday, August 5 from 2-4 pm and on Monday, August 19 from 2-4 pm.

Classes taught in Spanish will be: Email 1 (en Español) on Tuesday, August 6 from 6-8 pm; Email 2 (en Español) on Tuesday, August 20 from 6-8; Word 1 (en Español) on Thursday, August 8 from 6-8 pm and Saturday, August 10 from 11:30 am -1:30 pm. Word 2 (en Español) will be taught on Thursday, August 15 from 6-8 pm and Resume class 1 (en Español) will be held on Wednesday, August 14 from 6-8 pm and on Saturday, August 24 from 11:30 am-1:30 pm.

Attendance is on a first come, first served basis. All classes meet in the Technology Training Center of the Main Library at 5 Washington Street. Sign-in begins on the 3rd floor Victoria Technology Center thirty minutes before the class time.
