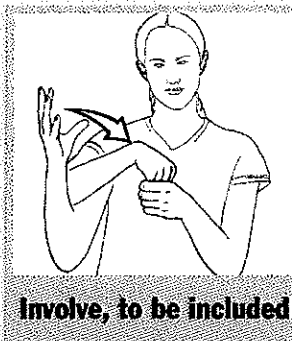

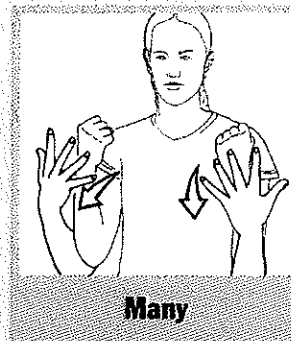


Come on

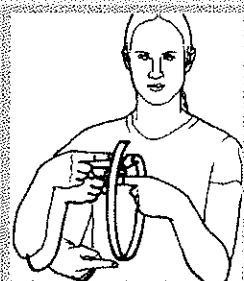
The sign *come on* is an informal way to sign to *join* or *come over here*. Use this sign to say *come on!* to encourage somebody to hurry up.



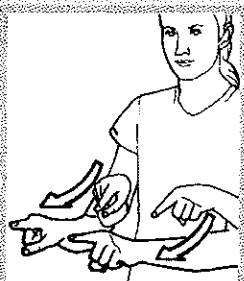

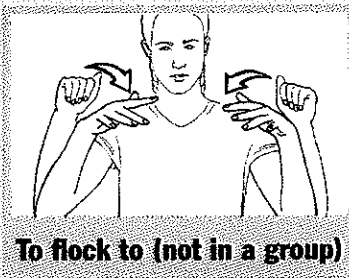


Not crazy for

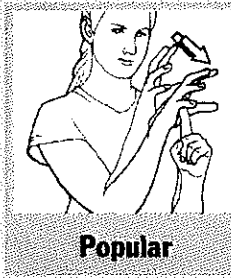

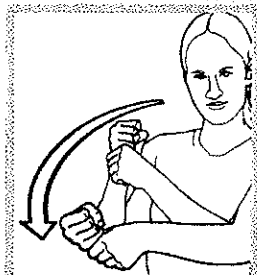

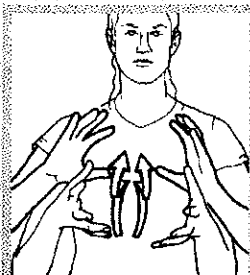
Flock to and *go to (plural)* share a similar concept. However, *flock to* is best used to describe large numbers of people.



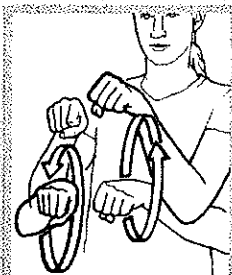

Accent Steps

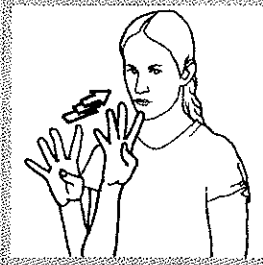
The signs *last month*, *last week*, and *last year* can be interpreted as "a month ago," "a week ago," and "a year ago." Sign *used to* to say "When I was..."



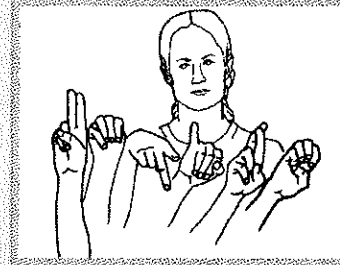
