The purpose of this order is to set forth procedures to be followed by department members when engaged in making mass arrests during times of demonstrations, sit-ins or riots.

I. INTRODUCTION

During a riot, demonstration or sit-in, when large numbers of persons are arrested, it is essential to process prisoners as expeditiously as the efficient use of available police manpower will permit.


To achieve this end:

- Arrest Assist Teams shall process all prisoners and evidence at precinct stations and police headquarters in accordance with the preliminary procedures set forth in this order.
- A one-page emergency arrest form, DP11587 (revised June, 1968), shall serve as a preliminary arrest record.
- Emergency Arrest numbers shall identify arrested persons during preliminary processing.
- Emergency arrest numbers shall identify all evidence collected with prisoners.
