WHO WAS JAMES BROWN?



James "Library" Brown (1937-1991) dedicated his professional life to curating and expanding the Library's collection of resources on the African American experience. He served as a librarian at the Newark Public Library for 29 years, holding the titles of Principal Librarian and Head of the African American Room. After his untimely death in 1991 at the age of 53, the African-American Room was renamed in his honor.




